

What is Arduino®

Arduino[®] is an open-source prototyping platform based on easy-to-use hardware and software. Arduino[®] boards are able to read inputs – light-on sensor, a finger on a button or a Twitter message – and turn it into an output – activating of a motor, turning on an LED, publishing something online. You can tell your board what to do by sending a set of instructions to the microcontroller on the board. To do so, you use the Arduino programming language (based on Wiring) and the Arduino[®] software IDE (based on Processing). 

Example

Use the Arduino[®] IDE library manager (Sketch > Include Library > Manage Libraries...) to install the IR remote library by shiriff, z3t0 and ArminJo.

Once installed, open the IRreceiveDemo sketch by going to File > Examples > IRremote > IRreceiveDemo.

Once uploaded, open the serial monitor (set to 115200 baud), point an IR remote to it (such as a TV remote) and press some buttons. You should see the IR commands showing up on the serial monitor.
